The parents of Robert Mogridge have not been determined and the parents of his two wives are not known. His marriages are recorded in the register of Bradninch Parish, which was begun in 1559:ⁱ

Robert Mogridge and Helen Dunsford apparently had a daughter Johan, who was stillborn or died shortly after birth, since church records do not indicate that she was baptized before her death on 06 March 1622/3. Helen died two weeks later, perhaps from birth complications:ⁱⁱ

Five of the children of Robert Mogridge and Dorothy Lovering were baptized at Bradninch Church:ⁱⁱⁱ

- 1624 Grace Mogridge the daughter of Robt Mogridge baptized the 7th daie of October
- 1627 William Mogridge the sonne of Robert Mogridge baptized the 4th daie of November
- 1630 John Mogridge the sonne of Rob Mogridge baptized the 11th daie of September
- 1633 Johan Mogridge the daughter of Robert Mogridge baptized the 16th daie of June
- 1636 Mary the daughter of Robert Mogridge was baptized the 14th daie of October

Robert Mogridge and Dorothy Lovering apparently had a son Richard who died before he was baptized. Robert Mogridge was buried at Bradninch Church on 21 May 1640. His wife Dorothy may have lived to old age, since a Dorothy Mogridge was buried there on 22 February 1690/1:iv

- 1625 Richard Mogridge the sonne of Robte Mogridge buried the 24 of Aug
- 1640 Rob Mogridge was bur the 21th daie of Maie
- 1665 Grace Mogridge was bur the 11 day of June
- 1690 William Mogridge bur the 31 day of Dec
- 1690/1 Dorothy Moggridge bur the 22 day of Januarie

Since there was no other Grace Mogridge of record at Bradninch during this period,

perhaps the daughter of Robert and Dorothy died unmarried. The burial of William Mogridge appears to apply to the son of Robert and Dorothy. Johan Mogridge married after her father's death:

1654 Mch 25 John Saunder of Bradninch & Joane Mogridge d of Dorothy Mogridge of Bradninch by Mr John Denner Mawr (Mayor) of the Borough and libertie of Bradninch

There may have been more than one William Mogridge in Bradninch Parish, to account for the following records, but all of them could apply to William, son of Robert Mogridge and Dorothy Lovering, who was born in 1627 and would have been twenty-six in 1653, when Elizabeth Mogridge, daughter of William Mogridge, was born:^{vi}

1653/4 Elizabeth the daughter of William Mogridge borne the Twenty first daye of December and baptized the sixth daie of Januarie

Because of a lapse of nine years before another child of William Mogridge appears in the parish records, perhaps Elizabeth was by a first wife. The second child of record was Dorothy who was buried in 1662, apparently before she could be baptized: vii

- 1662 Dorothy the d of William Moggridge was bur the 21 day of Jan
- 1663 Henry the sonne of William Mogridge was baptized the first day of September
- 1664 Henry the sonn of William Moggridge was bur the 12 day of Jan
- 1664/5 Dorothy the daughter of William Mogridge was baptized the 6 day of March
- 1667 William the sonn of William Moggridge was baptized the 16 day of May
- 1668 William the sonn of William Moggridge was bur the 20th day of Dec
- 1669 William the son of William Moggridge baptized the 12 day of August

The group of children, beginning with Dorothy in 1662 and ending with William in 1669, could be by a second wife Alice, who died in 1679:^{viii}

1679 Allis the wife of William Moggridge bur the 20 day of Aprill

A third group of children could be by a final wife Marie, whom William married on 23 December 1680:^{ix}

William Mogridge, Marie Mogridge, Dorothy Mogridge and two daughters of William Mogridge died during the winter of 1690-91:^x

Marie could have been his wife or his youngest daughter, but since two daughters were buried without recording their given names, it seems likely that Marie was his wife. Dorothy could have been the daughter of William, who was born in 1664/5 and, perhaps, was unmarried, or she could have been his elderly mother. The two unnamed daughters could be either Ann, Grace or Marie.

It is possible that Marie Mogridge, who was baptized on 11 September 1690, was a daughter of William Mogridge, Jr., who was born in 1669 and old enough in 1690 to be a father. If Marie was the daughter of William, Jr., she may have lived, leaving the identity of the two dead girls as Ann and Grace.

Marriages by the children of William Mogridge were not found in the Bradninch Parish Register. However, both Robert and Richard apparently had children:xi

Robert's wife Mary was buried in 1715:xii

Although Robert Mogridge did not use the names Roger and Christian for his children, he may have been a son of Roger Mogridge and Christian Lynnington, who were married on 27 June 1586:^{xiii}

1586 Jun 27 Roger Mogridge & Christian Lynnington

Roger and Christian had a son Jervase Mogridge who was baptized on 31 March 1588:^{xiv}

1588 Mch 31 Jervase Mogridge son of Roger

Jervase Mogridge married Margaret Haymon on 15 November 1620 and Robert Mogridge married Helen Dunsford on 06 May 1622,^{xv} so Robert and Jervase appear to be of the same generation and could have been brothers. Christian Lynnington Mogridge could have had another child, Robert, by her husband Roger in 1590, whose baptism was not recorded or found in the records.

Roger Mogridge apparently died before 1593 when the first of two illegitimate daughters of Christian Mogridge were baptized. Neither lived long and Christian was identified as a widow when the second was buried: xvi

Dorothie the base child of Christian Mogridge was bur the 19th

1600/1 Feb 17 Elizabeth Mogridge d of Christian base borne

There were other Mogridges buried at Bradninch whose relationships to one another or to Roger and Robert Mogridge is not known:^{xvii}

1566 Joane Mogridge widdow was buried the 20 daie of Marche

1577 Thomas Mogridge was bur the 20th daie of Nov

1585 Margerie Mogridge bastard was bur the 17th day of April

1588 Joane Mogridge was bur the 15th day of July

1601 Alce Mogridge was buried the 6th day of Aug

The use of the name, Johan or Joan, by Robert Mogridge, for his first daughter in 1622, and then by John Mogridge, for his first daughter in 1653, suggests continuity from the Joans of earlier generations in 1588 and 1566.

There were other Mogridges who have not been connected with Bradninch:xviii

1743 Daughter of John and Elizabeth Maugridge, aged 25 days, was baptized on 18 Dec

1731 William Morgridge, son of William, was baptized 5 Oct

1729 Mary, daughter of William Mogridge, baptized 7 Oct

1732 William, son of William Mogridge, baptized 5 June

In 1573 John Moggridge had two children baptized at the Abbey Church of Ss. Peter and Paul in Bath, England, which is in Somerset, near Bristol, and at some distance from Exeter:

1573 Thomas Byram baptized 8 Dec

1573 Agnes Moggridge baptized 27 Dec

Also recorded there were acts pertaining to three children of John and Frances Moggridge:

1680 Gervaise Moggridge buried 24 Mar

1681 Frances Moggridge baptized 12 Oct

1684 Matthew Moggridge baptized 23 Jun

John Moggridge, son of Jerom, was baptized there on 11 January 1570. John Moggridge and Elizabeth Slye apparently were married there on 02 February 1605.

The burial of John Moggridge, who was of the Peace, on 21 June 1702 is recorded in

the parish register, Society of Dublin.

Tristam Mogridge of "Bamford Speke" disclaimed "ignobilius" at the visitation of Devonshire in 1620 and proved himself qualified to be numbered among the nobility. Bramford Speke is a village a short distance north of Exeter.

William Maugridge of Bampton married Amy Menifie, daughter of Nicholas Menifie of Cullompton and his wife Joan Tye, who was a daughter of William Tye of Cullompton. Eampton is on the River Exe, north of Tiverton.

A branch of the Mogridge family married into one of the prominent Devonshire families of royal descent. John Mogridge(Moggridge) married Margaret Courtenay, daughter of Philip and Joan Courtenay, at Molland on 31 May 1705. Margaret's brother Lewis Courtenay married Jane Moggridge. Philip Courtenay, a descendant of Humphrey de Bohun, was buried at Molland on 08 October 1685. He and his wife Joan also had sons Philip Courtenay, Jr. and Thomas Courtenay.**

The last male heir of the Courtenay family of Molland was John Courtenay, esquire, who died in 1732, without issue. He was a direct descendant of John Courtenay, esquire of Molland, who died in 1510 and was buried at Molland Church. Married to Joan, daughter of Robert Brett of Pillond, in Bilton Parish, this earlier John was the son and heir of Sir Philip Courtenay, high sheriff of Devonshire in 10th Edward IV (1470), who was married to Elizabeth, daughter of Robert Hingeston of Wonewell (Wonville). As second son, Sir Philip inherited Molland from his father Sir Philip Courtenay, knight of Powderham Castle. The manor of Molland Botreaux in Devonshire came to Sir Philip of Powderham through his marriage to Elizabeth, daughter of Walter, Lord Hungerford. The Courtenays of Powderham originated with Sir Philip Courtenay, lieutenant of Ireland under King Richard II (1377-1399), who was the fourth son of Hugh Courtenay, 2nd Earl of Devon, and Margaret de Bohun, daughter of Humphrey de Bohun, Earl of Hereford and Essex, Iord high constable of England, and Princess Elizabeth Plantagenet, daughter of King Edward I.*Xii

Sir Philip Courtenay of Powderham, who married Elizabeth Hungerford and died on 16 December 1463, was a son of Sir John Courtenay and his wife Joan, daughter of Alexander Champernoun of Beer Ferrers and his wife Joan Ferrers. Sir John was a son of Sir Philip Courtenay of Powderham, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland in 1383, who died on 29 July 1406, and his wife Anne, daughter of Sir Thomas Wake of Blysworth. Sir Philip was a son of Sir Hugh de Courtenay, Earl of Devon, who was born on 12 July 1303 and died on 02 May 1377, and his wife Margaret, daughter of Humphrey de Bohun and Elizabeth Plantagenet, who died on 16 December 1391. Sir Hugh was a son of Sir Hugh de Courtenay, Earl of Devon, who died on 23 December 1340 and his wife Agnes, daughter of John de St. John and his wife Alice, who died on 11 June 1345. Sir Hugh was a son of Sir Hugh de Courtenay of Okehampton and his wife Eleanor, daughter of Hugh le Despenser and his wife Aline Basset. xxii

Elizabeth Hungerford who married Sir Philip Courtenay of Powderham was a daughter

of Sir Walter Hungerford, knight, Baron of Heytesbury and Homet, who was prominent in his services to Henry IV (1399-1413), Henry V (1413-1422) and Henry VI (1422-1461 and 1470-1471). Dying in 1449, he held at one time or another the offices of sheriff of Wiltshire, admiral of the fleet and treasurer of England. The mother of Elizabeth Hungerford was Catherine Peverell, daughter of Sir Thomas Peverell and Margaret Courtenay. Margaret Courtenay was a daughter of Sir Thomas Courtenay, knight of Southpole and Muriel de Moels. Sir Thomas Courtenay, who died in 36th Edward III (1363) was a younger brother of Hugh Courtenay, 2nd Earl of Devon, who died in 1377. Muriel de Moels was a daughter of John de Moels, 4th Baron Moels, who died in 1337.
