John Willcockson of Cossal in Nottinghamshire, England, whose son George married Elizabeth Powell,<sup>1</sup> appears to have been the son of Arthur and Dorothy Willcockson, who was born on the 14th day of the 09th month 1667 at Manley (Mandley), Cheshire, England. He married Dorothy Hall, daughter of John Hall, at the Hall home at Morrige in Staffordshire, England:<sup>2</sup>

1686 John Willcockson did take to wife Dorothy Hall in a meeting at her father

Dorothy Hall may have been born on 02d of 12m 1655, although this would make aged 31 at marriage.<sup>4</sup>

The town of Manley is north of Kelsall which is east of the city of Chester. There is a town named lpstones, south-southeast of Leek in Staffordshire, which may bear on the location of Morrige. Leek is about 35 miles, as the crow flies, east-southeast of Manley. Cossal is a village, about the same distance southeast of Leek, situated on the Nottingham Canal, west of the city of Nottingham, near the border of Derbyshire. Staffordshire and Nottinghamshire are separated by Derbyshire.<sup>5</sup>

The births of children of John and Dorothy Willcockson are recorded in the minutes of Staffordshire Monthly Meeting of the Friends (surname spelling variants are verbatim):<sup>6</sup>

It is a significant coincidence that George Willcockson, Jr., the presumed son of George Willcockson and Elizabeth Powell, married Elizabeth Hall. Later, in 1768/9, he was involved in a lawsuit with Samuel Hall, in Rowan County, North Carolina. John Willcockson, brother of George, Jr., witnessed a deed by William Hall in Rowan County in 1788.<sup>7</sup>

Elizabeth Hall, who married George Willcockson, Jr., may have been a granddaughter of Samuel Hall, a weaver, who lived in Kennet Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, in 1710. He died in 1738, leaving twelve children, Mary, who married Robert Whitacre; Sarah, who married David Bailey; Phebe, who married Calvin Cooper; Elizabeth, who married Robert Whiteside; Hannah; Dinah; Susanna; Margaret; George, who married Sarah Hoopes, daughter of Daniel Hoopes and Jane

Worrilow, and reputedly had twenty-four children; Samuel; James; and Charles Hall.8

Mary Hoopes, another daughter of Daniel and Jane Hoopes, married Philip Yarnall, who was closely associated with George and Elizabeth Powell Willcockson.

Daniel Hoopes was a son of Joshua and Isabel Hoopes, who came to Bucks County, Pennsylvania, from Cleveland in Yorkshire, England. Daniel moved to Chester County about 1696. He married Jane Worrilow, daughter of Thomas and Jane Worrilow of Edgmont.<sup>10</sup>

John Willcockson, who apparently was the eldest son of George Willcockson and Elizabeth Powell, married Sarah Boone, daughter of Squire Boone and Sarah Morgan. Squire Boone, George Willcockson and Samuel Hall were weavers.

Elizabeth Powell, who married George Willcockson, was a daughter of Rowland Powell and Maud Richard of Chester County, Pennsylvania. George Willcockson and Elizabeth Powell were married on the 15th of the 2nd month (April) 1719:<sup>12</sup>

Page 37 George Wilcockson, son of John Wilcockson of Nottingham, Great Britain and Elizabeth Powel, daughter of Rowland Powel of Haverford married in meetinghouse in Haverford 2.15.1719

Elizabeth Powell, daughter of Rowland and Maud Powell, was born on the 10th of the1st month (March), 1696. Rowland Powell and Maud Richard were married on the 10th of the 03rd month (May), 1695 at Haverford.<sup>13</sup>

George Willcockson died before 25 October 1739 in Chester County, Pennsylvania, when Elizabeth Willcockson was granted administration of his estate, against a bond in the amount of 160 pounds, secured by Philip Yarnall and Joseph Pugh.<sup>14</sup> Elizabeth Powell Willcockson died shortly thereafter, with the administration of her estate occurring in 1740. Philip Yarnall, administrator for Elizabeth Willcockson (Wilcox), widow and relict of George Willcockson (Wilcox), her late husband, who had died intestate, leaving several children to survive them, particularly Mary Willcockson (Wilcox), aged about five years, who needed support, petitioned the court for Mary Willcockson (Wilcox) to be bound out to John Yarnall until age eighteen, and to be taught to read and write, and "housifrey."<sup>15</sup>

Philip and John Yarnall provide a thread of circumstantial evidence connecting George and Elizabeth Powell Willcockson with the Boone family. After the death of Samuel Boone, brother of Squire Boone, Sr., his widow Elizabeth Cassel Boone married Joseph Yarnall, son of Francis Yarnall and Hannah Baker, on the 29th of the 07th month, 1748. The relationship between Philip, John and Joseph Yarnall has not been determined, but they must have been kin.

Anne Willcockson, daughter of John Willcockson and Dorothy Hall, married Jonathan Green on 11d 12m 1713/4 at Breach, Derbyshire, England.<sup>17</sup> His parents have not been determined.

Dorothy Willcockson, daughter of John Willcockson and Dorothy Hall, married John Bower, possibly the son of Henry Bower, on 25d 05m 1715, also at Breach. Their children were born at Ashover in Derbyshire.<sup>18</sup>

David Willcockson, son of John Willcockson and Dorothy Hall, married Alice Anderson on 18d 01m 1724 at Rilstone in Yorkshire. The parents of Alice, who died at age 85, have not been identified. David was a resident of Upper Bradley, Kildwick Parish, Yorkshire, when he married. Rilstone came under the Knaresborough Meeting.<sup>19</sup> Knaresborough is north of Leeds.
